BOARD REPORT

We welcomed a lot of new students and families to Clutha Valley School in Term 2 and I hope they are all settling well and enjoying being part of our community.

Some of you may have received an email with an invitation to join us at the Board meetings. This is an invite that is sent to a few different families each month to come along and join us at our monthly meeting to see what goes on. Every family should receive an email at some stage throughout the year. Whilst it is entirely optional to attend, there is an open invitation to every meeting and you are all most welcome to join us anytime, so please do come along if you are interested.

In June the board reviewed the Health and Physical Education Curriculum. The Ministry of Education is preparing a new curriculum for Health and Physical Education which will come into place in 2025. We also completed our review of the EOTC (Education Outside of the Classroom) policies.

Preparations are underway for our community consultation on our future strategic planning. Our Annual Report is available on the website and we are really pleased to see a positive result.

There was an incident recently regarding an injury to a student whilst playing in the hedge. Both the staff and the board have reviewed this and consulted with NZSTA. The children have been spoken to about the expected behaviour to keep this area a safe and fun environment for them to play in. Whilst there is always going to be an element of risk we feel the benefits such as upper body strength, coordination, collaboration, risk assessment etc far outweigh the risks involved, and the students really do enjoy playing and building in the hedge.

If you have driven past the school recently you will see the new school build is really starting to take shape now. The roof is well on its way to being completed. There was a Community Meeting held earlier in the month with Rick Jordan from the Ministry and the contractors, Alaska. Whilst there were initial delays with the foundations we are all very excited that they confirmed we are still on track to start 2024 in our new school!


