

JR Mckenzie High School Uniform Assistance for Transition to High School




TRANSITION TO SCHOOL

SPEED PAST THE SCHOOL

On 11 October the Clutha District Council Service Delivery Committee met. During this meeting information was presented by the Senior Infrastructure Engineer to inform the councillors decision making process. Although the engagement report describes that all schools suggested Category 1, it was suggested in the meeting to designate the following five schools to Category 2:

- Clutha Valley
- Waikoikoi
- Warepa
- Tahakopa
- Romahapa

The councillors' recommendation (as reported in the ODT Saturday 14 October) was that most schools should be Category 1 with exception of the five schools listed above.

What does this mean?

30km past schools (**Category 1**): This was deemed by the schools to be very understandable for all road users, as district wide it would be consistent, and most importantly a safer speed for our children.

60km past schools **(Category 2)**: this means the above five schools will be regulated at 60km. At rate payers' expense, area use factors will be reinvestigated every 2 years for Waka Kotahi to accept Category 2 status. Evidence suggests 60kms will result in serious injury or death if a pedestrian is involved in a crash at said speed.

If you would like our school to be 30km or you have other suggestions then go to: Feedback Form by 15 December. This document will lay out all proposed changes for Clutha District Schools: Draft Speed Management Plan Consultation for Schools
