MAY BOARD REPORT

Firstly I would like to acknowledge the tragic loss of a student from Whangarei Boys High School in the recent caving accident. Our thoughts have certainly been with his whanau and community in this extremely difficult time. It is very timely that this month our Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC) policy is the one that is up for review. So I would like to take this opportunity to assure you that at Clutha Valley Primary School we do have many measures in place to ensure our staff and students' safety outside of the classroom. For each trip a careful and thorough safety plan is drawn up identifying all potential hazards and plans to reduce risk and how to ensure both student and staff safety. Each plan is reviewed by another member of staff, and the principal or another senior member of staff in her absence. For any overnight trips or school camps there is a further review by ourselves, the Board of Trustees. Whilst preparing these plans can be demanding it does support staff and parents who volunteer to ensure that safety is placed as prime importance.

Also on a safety note, on 3rd May Val met with Simon McAtamney (Councillor), Jocelyn Lindner, the Roading Asset Management Officer, for the Clutha District Council and Rachel Harrison, Road Safety Coordinator, regarding the proposal for safer speeds around schools. They are considering reducing the speed limit around the school to 30 km/h with flashing lights on the Clutha Valley Road and stop signs on the side roads. They had the road outside of the school under surveillance for a month and we were astounded to learn that the net data showed 6,300 vehicles passing the school over that month with a minimum speed of 35km/hr and a maximum of 150km/hr!!

On a brighter note, you will have noticed the new school build is really starting to get underway now. In the next month we should have $\frac{2}{3}$ of the framework erected and then the roof can begin to be installed as well as the steps around the new building. We are also well through the process of finalising the new playground for the children which is very exciting! We want to really thank Chantelle Allan and Anne Relling for the huge amount of work and hours they have spent on this project. It looks set to be a really fun and challenging playground that I'm sure all the students will enjoy. There will be a community meeting regarding the new build on the 14th June, 7.30pm at school with Rick Jordan from the Ministry. You are all welcome to come along and hear what is happening and what we can expect in the coming months.

We discussed the students achievement data and analysed in depth where they are at in their structured literacy and how this programme is working throughout the school. We are so grateful to have such well presented and thorough data presented by Val and the staff to create great learning targets and goals in this year's strategic planning. We look forward to monitoring the progress of all the students throughout the year.

Finally with 'Dairy Farm Changeover Day' fast approaching we are unfortunately farewelling one of our

board members, Doug McLeod. We want to take this opportunity to thank Doug very much for his time on the board; we really enjoyed having him as part of the team and the contributions he made. We wish Doug, Emma and their family all the very best on their next chapter. This does create a vacancy and the board has voted to go through the selection process to fill this position.

We wish all our busy dairy farming families all the very best over the next few weeks, especially to those who are moving farms.

Our next meeting will be on the 26th June at 4.30pm and everyone is most welcome to attend.



THE INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS AND ASSESSMENTS FOR SCHOOLS COMPETITIONS (ICAS) 2023

Students are invited to participate in the International Competitions and Assessments (ICAS) programme. The competitions completed online are available for Year 3 to 8 students in all subjects except for writing which is for Year 4 - Year 8 students. They provide an opportunity for students to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external assessment situation. It provides teachers, parents and students with comprehensive reporting of results in English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling, Writing and Digital Technologies Skills. All students receive a certificate, an individual student report indicating which questions they answered correctly and their score compared with the rest of the students tested. The student report is also useful for highlighting student strengths and weaknesses in skills and processes in the ICAS they participate in.

Certificates are awarded for each year level in New Zealand as follows:

High Distinction to the top 1% of entrants
Distinction to the next 10% of entrants
Credit to the next 25% of entrants
Merit to the next 10% of entrants


RELIEF SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS URGENTLY NEEDED
