Thank you to everyone who supported Gumboot Friday today. A total of \$152.50 was raised, with all funds going towards supporting the free counselling in schools' programme.

Over the last year, as a school we have been working through an online course called Assessment for Learning. Assessment for Learning (AfL) refers to how both formal tests and informal observations of students, their work, and their responses in classroom discussion can be used to gain insight into their learning. Teachers and students learn together about what the students are learning, their progress and their needs. Most staff were awarded their certificates, alongside other teachers at a presentation in Balclutha on Wednesday afternoon this week. Congratulations to them all!

On Monday morning we will be holding a celebration at school to share with the EnviroSchools' facilitators the projects we have undertaken over the last few years. This is part of the process to become recognised with a Bronze EnviroSchool award which recognises how we are trying to

create a healthy and sustainable school environment. Thank you to Reegan and more latterly

Fiona who have both been instrumental in continuing the journey with EnviroSchools over the last few years.

LUNCHES/FOOD AT SCHOOL


This is just a reminder that **lollies and chewing gum are not items we welcome at school.** These have been steadily increasing across the school. **Please can these be kept at home.**

We have had quite an increase in the number of students asking for additional food at school. We have three break times at school where students are able to eat. 9.45am which is brain break, so a piece of fruit or a vegetable. 11.00am morning tea and 12.30pm which is lunch. Some students eat all their food at the first two breaks and have nothing left for lunch. If parents were able to pack extra it would be much appreciated. It would also be helpful if you could explain what they should eat at each break.

The other thing we have noticed is some students arriving at school in the morning and eating their food before school starts. Please can you ensure your child has breakfast in the morning. If this is an issue or your child simply does not want to eat early in the morning please let us know.

JR Mckenzie High School Uniform Assistance for Transition to High School

The JR McKenzie Youth Education Fund has a proud tradition of supporting families in need of financial assistance, with the purchasing of school uniform. If you require financial support to purchase uniform for your Year 8 student transitioning to High School please contact the school for an application form. This mainly music programme is run by volunteers from the


